Polio Today

World Polio Day is October 24. Consider how far we have come. Today, endemic wild poliovirus has been eliminated from all but four countries in the world (Afghanistan,India, Nigeria and Pakistan), and less than 2000 cases were reported worldwide in 2008. Though great progress has been made, challenges remain.

Overall, the quality of immunization campaigns must be improved, and more funding is critically needed. In response, governments, donors and international agencies have endorsed a plan with clear milestones to tackle these and other challenges to a polio-free world.
